

- Make notes on how it applies to your context.


Prepare your staff session

- Seat staff in mixed groups: Include TAs and teachers together.
- Encourage cross-key stage groupings (e.g. EYFS with UKS2).
- Provide paper and pens for note-taking, idea sketching, and planning.

Step 3 Play the video

- Start the video for the whole team.
- When you see the "Loading Fabulous Conversations" overlay: Pause the video.
- Ask teams to discuss the prompt/task presented. Begin with class teams, then share ideas across the wider staff.

Embed application during the session




Consider how strategies can be trialled immediately.




